## SICRHAU'R ADDYSG ORAU I DDISGYBLION GWYNEDD



Nod Cyngor Gwynedd ydi sicrhau bod holl ysgolion y sir yn arfogi plant a phobl ifanc i gyflawni'r safonau uchaf posib ac i adnabod ffyrdd creadigol o warchod addysg mewn cymunedau gwledig.

Ar hyn o bryd, mae ansawdd addysg ysgolion Gwynedd yn dda iawn, ond mae penaethiaid ysgolion ac arbenigwr addysg annibynnol wedi adnabod yr angen i ddatblygu ffyrdd newydd ac arloesol o weithio i sicrhau bod y llwyddiant presennol yr parhau. Maent wedi datgan yn glir fod risg sylweddol i safonau addysg yn ysgolion Gwynedd dros y blynnyddoedd nesaf os nad oes rhoi newidiadau yn cael eu gwneud i'r model presennol.

Os am gwrrd a'r nod o ddarparu addysg ardderchog i holl blant Gwynedd, mae penaethiaid wedi dwed bod rhaid cyfarfhorfa, sy'n cynnwys y ffafia:

- nad oes amser digonol i benaethiad fod yn arwain a llywio addysg yn eu hysgolion, datblygu a hyrwyddo ymarfer da, a rheoli staff a chyllidebau yn effeithiol;
- fod problemau cynyddol wrth recruiwtio penaethiaid ysgolion o'r newydd;
- fod aethrawon cynradd yn aml yn gorffod addysgu ystod eang o ddisgyblion o wahanol cedrannau a galluon iawn yn yr un dosbarth - ar adegau hyd at bedair blwyddyn ysgol mewn un dosbarth;
- fod aethrawon uwchradd yn aml yn gorffod addysgu sawl pwnc y tu allan i'w maes arbenigedd.

Dyweddodd Arwyn Thomas, Pennaeth Addysg Cyngor Gwynedd

"Dros y flwyddyn ddiwethaf, rydym wedi trafod a gwrandu yn olafus ar benaethiaid ysgolion Gwynedd.

"Mae'r trafodaethau yma wedi bod yn hynod gynhyrchiol ac yn sail ar gyfer

llunio egwyddorion newydd cychwynnol i amddiffyn safonau addysg ac i symud tua'r nod o sicrhau bod pob plentyn yn y sir yn derbyn addysg ardderchog a fydd yn eu galluogi i fyw a ffynnu'n lleol.

"Mae'r trafodaethau cychwynnol yma wedi cadarnhau a chrisialu'r ffait fod yr her ym maes arweinyddiaeth ysgolion yn dwyshau yn flynyddol. Mae hyn yn amlwg yn rhwybeth na allwn ei anwybyddu os ydym o ddifrif am ddiogelu ansawdd addysg yn y sir, gan gynnwys addysg wledig."

Meddai'r Cynghorydd Gareth Thomas, Aelod Cabinet Addysg Cyngor Gwynedd:

"Mae staff ysgolion Gwynedd wedi llwyr ymrwymo i ddarparu'r addysg orau bosib i'n plant. Ond rydym angen trafod a chytuno ar egwyddorion newydd er mwyn osgoi dirywiad dros y blynnyddoedd i ddod.

"Fel cam cychwynnol, rydym wedi dechrau ar y gwaith hanfodol yma drwy wahodd penaethiaid ysgolion y sir i ddifinio'r heriau maent yn eu hwynue ac rydan ni'n hynod ddiolchgar iddynt am fod yn barod i gyfrannu'n llawn i'r gwaith. Mae'r hyn maent wedi ei adnabod yn cydfyng gyda barn Estyn, yr arolygoedd ysgolion, sef fod arweinyddiaeth dda yn allweddol er mwyn sicrhau addysg o'r ansawdd uchaf i'n plant.

"Dros yr wythnosau nesaf, byddwn yn ymhwâl â chymunedau ym mhob rhan o Wnedd - ac rydym yn awyddus i ddatblygu egwyddorion ar y cyd gyda'r proffesiwn, llywodraethwyr a rhieni fel y gallwn symud ymlaen gyda'n gilydd."

### ENSURING THE BEST FOR GWYNEDD PUPILS



Gwynedd Council's objective is that all the county's schools equip children and young people to achieve the highest possible standards. The Council is also committed to finding creative ways of safeguarding education in rural communities.

Whilst the quality of education in Gwynedd schools is currently very good, headteachers and independent educational specialists have identified the need to develop new and innovative ways of working to ensure that this success continues. They have clearly stated that there is a significant risk to educational standards in Gwynedd schools over the coming years unless some changes are made to the current model.

If the objective of providing excellent education to all Gwynedd children is to be achieved, headteachers have said that certain challenges must be addressed. These include:

- a lack of adequate time for headteachers to lead and to steer education in their schools, to develop and to promote good practice, and to effectively manage staff and budgets;
- increasing problems in recruiting headteachers;
- primary schoolteachers often having to teach a wide range of pupils of different ages and abilities in the same class - up to four school years in one class at some times;
- secondary schoolteachers often having to teach several subjects outside their area of expertise.

Arwyn Thomas, Gwynedd Council's Head of Education, said:

"Over the past year, we have held discussions with Gwynedd headteachers and have listened carefully to them.

"These discussions have been extremely productive and have provided a basis for setting out new initial principles to protect educational standards and for moving

towards the goal of ensuring that all children in the county receive an excellent education that will enable them to live and to thrive locally.

"These initial discussions have confirmed and highlighted the fact that we are facing a challenge in school leadership and that it is increasing on an annual basis.

"Clearly, this is something that we cannot ignore if we are serious about safeguarding the quality of education in the county, including education in rural areas."

Councillor Gareth Thomas, Gwynedd Council's Cabinet Member for Education, noted:

"Gwynedd's school staff are fully committed to providing the best possible education for our children. However, we need to discuss and to agree on new principles in order to avoid a decline over the coming years.

"As an initial step, we have started on this essential work by inviting the county's school headteachers to define the challenges facing them and we are extremely grateful to them for their willingness to contribute fully to the work. What they have identified is in line with the school inspectorate Estyn's opinion that good leadership is vital in achieving education of the highest quality for our children.

"Over the next few weeks, we will be visiting communities in all parts of Gwynedd - and we are eager to be develop principles in collaboration with the profession, governors and parents so we can move forward together."
