







11. Sporting Aims and Achievements

The school attaches a great deal of importance and status to several sports activities and use is made of the hall, Canolfan Hamdden Dwyfor, resources at Ysgol Glan-y-môr and Clwb Chwaraeon Pwllheli to provide a range of sports.

We use the leisure centre to develop swimming skills and to hold an annual competitive triathlon for the school's eldest children. In addition to the above activities, the school hall is used for dance and gymnastics activities.

The school took part in football, cricket, hockey and athletics in the catchment area for KS2 pupils. The football team (Y.3 and 4 and Y.5 and 6) won a tournament organized among local schools to raise money for the cerdd-dant festival. The Y.5 and 6 11-a-side team also took part in various friendlies at Eifion Wyn, Maesincla, Maenofferen and Bro Lleu schools.

The school organizes and supports numerous sports clubs (including organizing a triathlon for Y.5 and 6 pupils for the first time this year) and celebrates the children's successes publicly, e.g. during morning assemblies, and a record is included in the scrapbook in the school foyer.

14. Changes to the School Prospectus

An Information for Parents booklet is issued annually and contains information about school organization and rules. A copy of the handbook is on the school's website and a paper copy is available at the school at parents' request. At the start of every school year the handbook is presented to parents and may inform of changes to school policies.

15. Curriculum

Like every other school, Ysgol Cymerau follows the National Curriculum for Wales and aspects of the National Literacy and Numeracy Framework. Our school handbook contains a summary of the school's curriculum.

Additional Learning Needs (ALN) at the school:

The school's objective is to identify children with ALN at an early stage in order to offer them the best and most comprehensive provision possible, helping the pupils to achieve their full potential.

To this purpose, detailed Individual Education Plans are drawn up for the children and we will be reviewing these with parents. The ALN Co-ordinator at Ysgol Cymerau is Mrs Helen Vaughan Jones and Mrs Siân Watson

is the designated governor for ALN. The school targets each child who is on the 'School Action' stage (support organized and paid for by the school) or 'School Action Plus' (support from the school and from another agency) to attain expected levels.

We do not set the same target for pupils who are on **the old 3* stage** or who are **Statemented** (children who usually require an assistant in class to help them at various times) especially in the aspect of work where they are experiencing difficulties. Challenging targets that are within their abilities are set for these pupils.

The numbers of ALN children in each year are comparatively high, and this affects the school's results.

Pupils with Disabilities:

The school will ensure full access for pupils with disabilities and has a purpose-built therapy room. The school's policies ensure that disabled pupils are not treated less favourably than other pupils.

16. Language Category

The school is a bilingual school.

17. Use of Welsh

Welsh is the school's principal language.

Welsh is the principal language of the Foundation Phase – children who do not speak Welsh are 'immersed' in the language and soon become fluent speakers.

Welsh is the school's main language of communication. The aim of Gwynedd Schools' Welsh Language Charter is that every child speaks Welsh on the corridors and outside on the playground.

In compliance with Gwynedd's Language Policy, every child is taught through the medium of Welsh. English is informally introduced at the end of the Foundation Phase and formally from Year 3. Our aim is to ensure that every child is bilingually fluent when he/she leaves the school.

If a non-Welsh speaking child attends the school, he/she will be 'immersed' in the language in the Foundation Phase and will attend the local Language Unit (Llangybi) for a term in Key Stage 2.

18. School Toilets

There are purpose-built toilets, including 'small' toilets, in the Foundation Phase – a ratio of approximately 1:10.

There are separate toilets for the boys and girls in KS2 - a ratio of approximately 1:10.

Staff toilets are located off the school foyer.

The toilets are cleaned daily.
